This summer, Florida State University will again be sponsoring the Saturday-at-the-Sea Summer Day Camp (SATS Camp). This program introduces late middle school and early high school students to experimental marine biology. This program is funded by the Office of Science Teaching Activities at Florida State University. Each camp will include up to 12 students and 2 teacher participants. To be eligible, students must be Florida residents, able to swim and currently enrolled in 7th, 8th, 9th or 10th grade.

As a science teacher, your role is very important to this program. Please nominate up to 5 of your students. We are not only looking for only your best and brightest students, but also those need encouragement to develop their enthusiasm for science. We are looking for a diverse group of students who are inquisitive and enthusiastic about the opportunity to participate in this camp. We enclosed five student nomination forms (blue forms) for you to fill out. The green forms must be completed by the student nominee with their parents or guardians. Student/Parent applications (green forms) are due back to you by **Friday, 31 March 2017**. Nominees are asked to write a brief essay explaining why they would like to come to the camp. Final selection will be based on the information you provide and the student's essay.

For a nomination to be considered, the entire application (blue and green forms) must be postmarked, emailed or faxed by **Friday**, **April 7**, **2017**. They must be sent to one of the following:

Camp Goal: The goal of SATS Camp is providing positive, science-related experiences to encourage Florida students to seek further scientific instruction and scientific careers. We also hope to raise their environmental awareness as they learn more about coastal marine habitats.

DATES: June 5 – 9, June 19 – 23, July 3 – July 7, July 10 – 14, and July 17 – 21.

ELIGIBILITY: Florida residents that are strong swimmers who are nominated by their current science

teacher

DEADLINE: The entire application must be postmarked by Friday April 7, 2017

Camp Details: Campers will spend their time at the FSU Coastal and Marine Lab. They will form research teams to investigate ecological questions. They will also learn about local sea creatures and coastal habitats. Campers will collect and analyze data, discuss and interpret their results, and present their findings to their peers. They will become marine scientists for the week! Never fear, SATS Camp will not be all work and no play! Students may snorkel on Turkey Point shoal, investigate animal behavior, explore salt marshes, observe oyster bars, survey sandy beaches, and take a night boat ride to the local seagrass meadows!

The groups will meet each morning at the FSU campus in Tallahassee. They will travel to and from the Florida State Coastal and Marine Laboratory in a mini bus. Every camp will have one overnight stay at the FSU Coastal & Marine Lab for evening field work. This is usually on Thursday night. For the overnight stay, dinner and breakfast will be provided, but students will need to bring their own lunches for each day (two lunches).

Dear Parent/Guardian of a SATS Camp Nominee:

Your child has been nominated by their science teacher to participate in the Saturday-at-the-Sea Summer Day Camp (SATS Camp). This camp teaches students about coastal resources and stimulates their interest in marine biology. Camp is always a fun and challenging introduction to this exciting field. These free, week-long day camps are funded by the Office of Science Teaching Activities at Florida State University.

Campers become part of a marine biology research team to study the Gulf Coast ecology at the Florida State University Coastal & Marine Laboratory. During camp week, we will explore marine habitats and conduct scientific studies. On the last day of camp, the students will present their research.

If your child is accepted into SATS camp you will need to provide shorts/bathing suits, old tennis shoes, and a sack lunch each day (dinner and breakfast will be provided for the overnighter). They need to be dropped off at 7:45 am and picked up 5:00 pm at the FSU campus near the King Building. They will travel by bus to and from the FSU Coastal & Marine Laboratory. Students from Wakulla/Franklin Counties may make alternate transportation options. There will be one overnight stay at the marine lab on Thursday night to do evening fieldwork. We will also require that you and your child attend a pre-camp orientation on Saturday, May 20th, from 10:00am - 12:00pm.

To give your child the best chance at being selected to participate, please help her/him to fill out the attached student application. Please make sure that all possible dates for participation are marked and ranked on the application form. On the back of the application form, your child must also write a short essay about why they would like to attend the SATS Camp. Return completed application to your child's teacher as quickly as possible to ensure that the entire application packet can be returned to us on time. Students must return the student/parent portion of the application to their nominating teacher by Friday, March 31, 2017.

You will be notified **VIA EMAIL** by Friday, April 28th, if your child is chosen to participate. If accepted, you will receive more details regarding the camp.
