

Does competition occur between *G. sabrinus* and *G. fuscus*?

- Alone, both species survive at varying elevations with *G. fuscus* surviving better at higher elevations than *G. sabrinus*.
- Competition occurs because growth of both species decreases in the presence of one another, and at high elevations one species will go extinct.
- At higher elevation (about 1200-1600m) when both species are present, *G. fuscus* survives and *G. sabrinus* reaches extinction.
- At an elevation of about 1140-1150m, the two species have the possibility of coexisting.
